The Exercise Biology Program is looking for qualified graduate students in basic biology and/or biomechanics to teach required upper division laboratory classes in exercise biology.

Qualifications: To have completed the pre-requisite lower division courses in the physical, chemical and biological sciences. For those interested in biomechanics, it is expected that you would have completed the physical sciences, and had the equivalent of the 1 series in chemistry and biology. A single course in basic physiology and/or engineering is important.

Educational Experience: A general understanding of system physiology, basic principles of regulation and control homeostasis, general limits of physiological responses or capacities and a reasonable amount of laboratory experience.

Teaching Ability: It would be helpful, but not expected, that you have had some personal experience in physical training or conditioning. That you are generally comfortable and confident in working with and applying standards, quantitative laboratory methodology. You can be taught the a, b, c's of exercise ergometry.
